

Year 11 Subject Lines – 2026

It is with pleasure that we release subject lines for Year 11 2026. Families of current Year 10 students have been given this information for further discussion with students over the Term 3 break. Any questions regarding these subject selections should initially be directed to your child's advisor or to specific subject teachers. Parents may also contact the Director of Teaching and Learning (dotl@as.edu.au) for further advice once initial conversations have been had with specific subject teachers. These choices are due by the end of Week 1, Term 4.

Final Subject Selections for Year 11 2026 students

- Students have access to these subject lines via Edval from the start of Term 4 to enter their final selections for 2026. We ask that families speak with their child to gain access to this link or contact the Director of Teaching and Learning if they need to confirm what students have submitted.
- Students need to choose their first 12-13 units in preferential order, plus four units of reserve subjects that may be used in the circumstance that their first preferences cannot be accommodated. Students may not receive their preferred subject's if classes are full or if students do not meet prerequisite knowledge or previous study (e.g. Languages or Extension English/Mathematics). First preferences for subjects will be given to those who had previously chosen that subject in the initial survey conducted early in Term 3 (**this is particularly the case for Hospitality**).
- Please note that the subject lines below have been designed to achieve the best solution for the year group as a whole. No subject is able to be moved from the lines published below.
- Students choosing Mathematics Extension 1 must also choose Mathematics Advanced = 3 units
- Students choosing English Extension 1 must also choose English Advanced = 3 units
- VET courses may continue well beyond normal school hours (often finishing between 5pm and 6pm)
- Places in VET classes are limited and students in the SBAT (School Based Apprentice Training) program are prioritised in these courses where relevant to their chosen trade.

Important notes to remember

- Classes in English Advanced, English Standard, Mathematics Advanced and Mathematics Standard will be streamed on academic ability.
- Students and families will receive an email confirming their final courses for 2026 during Term 4. The Director of Teaching and Learning will notify parents if there are any concerns regarding choices or suitability for your child.
- Those students interested in an SBAT pattern of study are to select IBL (Industry Based Learning), one English Course, one Mathematics Course and any other subjects to equate to 12 units of study – one or more VET courses can make up this pattern of study. If they are planning on studying at TAFE, this will count as one of their 2 Unit subjects. (Any changes regarding a pattern of study for SBAT students can be negotiated in Term 4 once an employer has been secured.)
- While Mathematics is not compulsory, students are encouraged to study it due to the ongoing application of this subject to our lives beyond school.
- Due to low interest, a small number of subjects will not run and as such, have not been listed below. If a subject listed below doesn't get the required numbers, it may be removed from the lines.
